### HŌʻIHI AKU, HŌʻIHI MAI

Give respect and you will receive respect

Every day, more and more people are developing an appreciation for the unique and precious flora found in Hawai'i, and many dedicated professionals and volunteers are working for its conservation. Please join them in safeguarding the future of our islands' plants and their natural environment.

The agencies and programs that manage rare plants in Hawai'i visit rare plant habitats only when absolutely necessary in order to carry out essential and beneficial recovery efforts for a species. Precautions are always taken to minimize their impact. We encourage plant enthusiasts to refrain from visiting rare plants and abide by the guidelines outlined below:



#### Keep your distance!

Stay on official roads, trails and paths, and do not approach rare plants within 10 ft. To enjoy the beauty of a plant, use binoculars and telephoto lenses



#### Use discretion!

Share rare plant locations only with rare plant management programs



#### Respect the law!

Rare, threatened and endangered plants are protected by State and Federal laws



# Be mindful when photographing!

Do not post or share rare plant location information on social media



# Do not collect any plant material, seeds or seedlings!

Collecting plant material harms the plant's ability to survive, grow and reproduce, and is also against the law without a permit



# Practice hiking protocols that protect rare plants and their environment!

Clean your hiking gear thoroughly before and after visiting a natural area to prevent the introduction of invasive species
